Education Priorities 2026 - 2027

AfPP is exposed to emerging perioperative challenges through our national initiatives, member feedback, audit activity, and engagement with perioperative professionals across the UK. These insights have helped shape AfPP 2026-2027 education, ensuring programmes reflect current clinical risks, workforce pressures, and the realities of practice.

Priority themes include:

- Implementing NatSSIPs 2 consistently
- Infection prevention in theatres
- Safe staffing and supervision
- Civility, psychological safety, and team behaviours
- Updates in perioperative clinical practice and emerging guidance

These priorities guide our programme development and ensure education reflects current perioperative risks and service needs.

Learning Pathways

AfPP's Learning Pathways provide a framework of development opportunities designed to meet the needs of individuals across the perioperative professions. Each pathway supports professional practice, whether for those beginning their careers, practitioners consolidating or extending their expertise, or leaders and managers seeking to strengthen team capability and culture.

The pathways are organised to ensure clarity, progression, and relevance. They help learners identify education aligned with their role, responsibilities, and future development needs, while supporting departments to plan training that reflects local service priorities.

Each pathway includes education delivered through conferences, workshops, online learning, and bespoke AfPP Academy training. Programmes include defined learning outcomes, CPD mapping, and practical tools to support implementation in operating departments.

Together, these pathways form a suite of education that supports safe practice, professional growth, and the continued advancement of perioperative care.

Clinical Practice

To strengthen the core knowledge and practical skills required to deliver safe and effective perioperative care.

Education within this pathway includes

- Infection prevention and control for theatres
- Scrub practice essentials
- Anaesthetic practice essentials
- Recovery practice fundamentals

Safety and Quality

To strengthen safety culture and improve patient outcomes through consistent application of national guidance and governance processes.

Education within this pathway includes

- NatSSIPs 2: The 8 Sequential Steps in Practice
- Human factors education (short sessions to full-day programmes)
- Communication skills for safer practice
- Risk management, quality assurance, and audit
- Quality improvement fundamentals



Leadership and Culture

To develop leaders who inspire safe, inclusive and high-performing teams.

Education within this pathway includes

- Introduction to leadership
- Inclusivity and Team Collaboration
- Teamworking and Communication
- Professionalism, accountability and reliability
- Communication and civility, including the AfPP Behaviours Charter
- Psychological safety and speaking up

Professional Growth

To support personal development, professional confidence, and lifelong learning.

Education within this pathway includes

- Understanding the role of the trainer
- Mentoring and supporting teams
- Coaching skills
- Giving and receiving feedback effectively
- The value and impact of CPD

Wellbeing and Resilience

To promote personal wellbeing and sustainable careers in high-pressure theatre environments.

Education within this pathway includes

- Emotional intelligence
- Reflection, resilience and personal growth
- Supporting wellbeing in high-pressure perioperative environments
- Stress awareness and self-management
- Burnout awareness and prevention
- Work-life balance and boundary setting

How Learning Pathways Support Departments

Learning Pathways help departments to:

- Plan structured CPD programmes
- Address local incident themes and service priorities
- Support staff development and retention
- Evidence training for governance and inspection requirements

Education can be delivered as stand-alone sessions or combined into tailored programmes through AfPP Academy.



New for 2026-2027 – Perioperative Leadership in Practice

Developing confident leaders to coordinate safe, effective perioperative care

Perioperative Leadership in Practice is AfPP's flagship 2-day programme designed to support practitioners stepping into, or developing within, first-line leadership roles in the operating department. It is suitable for those new to coordinating theatre activity, as well as those already undertaking shift leadership who wish to strengthen their knowledge, confidence, and consistency in the role.

The programme focuses on the practical application of leadership in perioperative settings, including shift coordination, prioritisation, situational awareness, and structured communication. It supports participants to understand their responsibilities in maintaining safety, patient flow, and standards of care, and to recognise and escalate risk appropriately. It also introduces core people leadership skills, including coaching, feedback, and managing challenging situations at an early stage, alongside key concepts such as safe staffing, psychological safety, and improvement in practice.

Delivered as an in-person, interactive programme, learning is supported through short taught sessions, case-based discussion, and peer learning. Participants are provided with practical tools and frameworks that can be applied directly in the operating department to support consistent leadership behaviours, effective team coordination, and the delivery of safe, high-quality perioperative care.

AfPP Academy – Bespoke Organisational Training

AfPP Academy provides tailored education for operating departments based on local service priorities. Training can address incident themes, workforce development needs, culture improvement, or governance requirements.

Education can be delivered on-site or online as half-day or full-day sessions and includes practical sessions and facilitated discussion to support real change in practice.

Symposiums

Delivered by experienced speakers from clinical practice, education, and patient safety, the programme uses real-world examples to explore how human factors influence communication, decision-making, and team performance, supporting practitioners to recognise risk and apply practical strategies in the operating department.

Theatre Access Course for Company Representatives

AfPP's Theatre Access Course prepares company representatives and other visitors to work safely within operating departments. The course covers infection prevention requirements, theatre attire, professional conduct, confidentiality, and expected behaviour within restricted areas.

This training helps departments ensure visitors understand theatre protocols, support safe introduction of equipment and devices, and work appropriately with clinical teams.
